An organization of Maine writers actively engaged in creating poetry, who wish to:

membership

By paying the annual dues, anyone may become a member who:

- ❖ subscribes to the objectives of the society
- ❖ agrees to participate regularly in the activities of the society

meetings and gatherings

General meetings are held twice a year in different parts of the state.

Guests are welcome!

Meetings are scheduled from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and include:

- ❖ coffee and registration (a \$10 registration fee is charged for members and guests)
- ❖ brief business meeting
- ❖ open mic (sign up on registration; preference given to those who have not submitted a poem for the contest)
- ❖ workshop and/or discussion
- ❖ lunch (please bring a bag lunch)
- ❖ poetry contest results
- ❖ critique of winning poems by the contest judge, followed by a reading of his/her own work

The winter general meeting has been replaced by smaller gatherings in January, February, and March at three different locations with different facilitators and opportunities for learning and interaction.

contests

One contest, open to members only, is held in conjunction with each gathering to give opportunity and encouragement to keep writing and to receive constructive feedback, recognition, and praise from knowledgeable judges. Subject/form and line limit for each contest are announced in the preceding newsletter. Poems are sent anonymously to judges who make written decisions and comments on each entry, presented orally at the meeting. Judges' choices of the top three entries in each contest are recognized with certificates, cash awards, and publication in the newsletter. Honorable mentions for each contest are awarded certificates.

Stanza, the MPS newsletter, issued after each general meeting and prior to the winter gatherings, features:

- ❖ publication of the winning poems in each contest
- ❖ announcement of honorable mentions (may be published if space allows)
- ❖ reports of the most recent gathering
- ❖ date and location of next meeting
- ❖ plans for the next contest
- ❖ member news
- ❖ general poetry news
- ❖ markets

history

The Waterville Poets Club and the Dover-Foxcroft Poetry Circle joined in 1936 to form the Poetry Fellowship of Maine. In 1993, the name was changed to Maine Poets Society to reflect the organization's changing emphasis on a statewide network of writers sharing their work.

The society is affiliated with the National Federation of State Poetry Societies (NFSPS).
